To qualify for an exemption from the Bond of Qualifying Individual (BQI) requirement, the Responsible Managing Officer, Responsible Managing Manager, or Responsible Managing Member must own 10% or more of the voting stock or equity of the corporation or limited liability company (LLC). A Bond of Qualifying Individual Exemption Request must be submitted to establish the exemption. **Note: All Responsible Managing Employees must have BQI's and cannot qualify for the exemption.**
